## CLASS OF 2024—SENIORS

By this time, the bulk of college applications have been submitted. Everyone has worked diligently throughout the college application process, and many seniors have started receiving acceptance letters. Some colleges accept applications through mid-February and some accept applications through July if they offer rolling admission. Now is the time to apply to any additional colleges based on new information or awareness of different priorities.

Seniors should also update their college decision status/acceptance status in Naviance. Instructions on how to do this were sent by email and have been posted on the Senior Postsecondary Google Classroom page. Seniors should continue applying for scholarships this semester. Scholarships will continue to be posted on the Senior Postsecondary Google Classroom page. Parents and seniors should also make sure to complete the FASFA if it is not already completed.

# CLASS OF 2025—JUNIORS

Junior Parent Night - Mr. von Boeck will host a virtual meeting for parents of Juniors on Tuesday, March 12th, at 6:30 p.m. The Zoom link can be found here.

Mr. von Boeck has begun individual meetings with the juniors and will continue these meetings throughout February and into March.

**Standardized Testing** - Juniors take the SAT on April 19 at MacLaren. The SAT is used as a college entrance exam and students can choose to send their scores to up to six colleges at the time of the exam. Although April 19 is the only date MacLaren will be offering the SAT, students are welcome to register to take the exam additional times by logging into their College Board account. Students can get assistance registering for additional exams <a href="here">here</a>. MacLaren does not offer the ACT, but students interested in taking it can register <a href="here">here</a>. Students who desire to write the optional SAT essay should let Dr. Holiday know by February 14.
